

IMPORTANT

- Please be aware that if, as a small company, you have already submitted a claim for Employment Allowance then you cannot claim it again via the Furlough Scheme
- If you try and claim it twice your claim will be rejected and your furlough payments will be delayed
- Once you have submitted your claim it cannot be amended so make sure you carefully check the information you have included prior to submission
- You will need to be registered online for PAYE in order to make a claim

CLAIMING FOR FURLOUGH

Blue Peak Commentary

The Government portal is now open for you to claim back payments on employees who you have furloughed. You can backdate to March 1st and therefore claim for March and April salaries, NIC contributions and minimum pension payments. Assuming your inputs are correct, payments are expected within a week.

The HMRC link for making a claim is www.gov.uk/guidance/claim-for-wages-through-the-coronavirus-job-retention-scheme

To make the claim please have to hand:

- 1. UK bank account number and sort code where you would like the Company's payment to be made
- 2. Your employer PAYE scheme reference number (You will most easily find this on a payslip)
- 3. The number of employees being furloughed
- 4. Each employee's National Insurance number (You will most easily find this on their payslips)
- 5. Each employee's payroll or employee number (This is optional and you may not use these references)
- 6. The start date and end date of the claim (This is the date the employee stopped working and became furloughed. If you would like to claim for April's salary then you can use the end date of 30 April 2020)
- 7. The full amount you're claiming for, including employer National Insurance Contributions and employer minimum pension contributions. (There is a useful calculator on the HMRC website. In some cases this won't apply for example, for Directors. If you have any questions please contact us)
- 8. Your contact details
- 9. Your Corporation Tax Unique Taxpayer Reference (The easiest place to find this is on your government gateway portal, however can also be found on HMRC correspondence regarding Corporation Tax, or on a prior year Corporation Tax return)
- 10.If you are a sole trader, your Self Assessment Unique Taxpayer Reference (The easiest place to find this is on your personal tax government gateway portal, however can also be found on HMRC correspondence regarding self-assessment, or on a prior year tax return)
- 11. Your Company registration number (You will be able to easily locate this in Companies House by looking up your Company name)

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Employer PAYE reference:

You must read the following before making a claim

The Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme reimburses employers for costs of employing furloughed employees arising from the health, social and economic emergency resulting from coronavirus

HMRC will check your claim and may refuse or recover payment if your claim:

- · is not made in accordance with HMRC's published guidance
- · contains or is based on inaccurate information
- · is paid in error
- is fraudulent or abusive or not made for the purpose described above.

Has the employer 'furloughed' any employees because of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak?

'Furlough' refers to employees who have been asked to stop working for at least 3 weeks, but who are still being kept on their employer's payroll. This can include employees who have been made redundant between 28 February 2020 and 19 March 2020, but have now been rehired and furloughed by the

To be eligible, the furloughed employee can not do any work for or on behalf of the employer whilst they are on a leave of absence. This includes providing services or generating revenue.

Employees should be paid in line with the employer's payroll.

Employers must not charge any fees from the money they receive from HMRC. The employer can choose to pay the employee the remaining 20% of their wages, but they do not have to.












In this section you will need to tell us about the claim period

This refers to a period in which the employer has made or will make one or more payments to the furloughed employees.

If the employees have been furloughed for a minimum of 3 weeks, the employer can claim for 80% of their wages, up to a cap of £2,500 per employee plus the cost of employer National Insurance contributions and pension contributions (up to the level of the minimum automatic enrolment employer pension contribution).

You must tell us about all employees who are furloughed in the claim period. This should include furloughed employees who are paid weekly, every two weeks, or monthly. You will not be able to make another claim for the same claim period.

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

Once HMRC have received this claim and checked that it is eligible, the claim amount will be paid via BACS payment to the employer's UK bank account.




